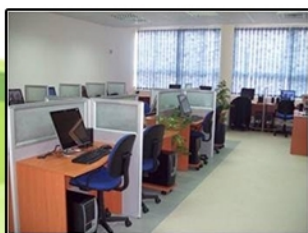


Admission Requirements and Language of Instruction

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Program Facilities

- The program is run and provided by a group of highly qualified dedicated faculty members who efficiently apply novel teaching and learning methodology.
- The class rooms are well equipped for various teaching techniques with a class size of 60 students that facilitates the application of self-learning and student-based learning techniques whenever applicable.
- The laboratories are properly equipped to facilitate safe and efficient performance of various experiments that help understanding the theoretical bases of different courses.
- Dry labs are also available for simulation programs that serve the teaching and learning process.
- The highly specialized scientific library contains various books and periodicals in the field of pharmacy in addition to a modern digital library.



Student Activities

- All faculty students are encouraged to join various cultural, artistic and sport activities held and supervised by the Student Union along with the Youth Welfare Department in the faculty.
- Different assemblies and associations including ASPSA (Alexandria Scientific Pharmaceutical Student Association) are also organizing scientific forums, artistic exhibitions, medical convoys and charity work in coordination with the Youth Welfare Department.
- Field trips to pharmaceutical companies are also organized to improve student knowledge and links with the pharmaceutical industry.

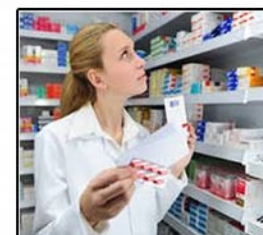
PharmD Program Career opportunities

Program Structure

5. The student chooses the appropriate courses and completes the curriculum registration form, and approves it from the academic advisor, the head of the Department Council, and Vice Dean for Graduate Studies and Research.

6. Registration is a prerequisite for the student to be allowed to attend and account for his courses.

7. The student is not considered registered in any course until the payment of tuition fees within the specified dates.

8. A student who does not complete the course registration procedures before the end of the second week of the fall and spring semesters or the first week of the summer semester is not entitled to attend lectures.

Academic load:

Students are allowed to register in the fall and spring semesters, with no more than 16 credit hours per semester. The student is also allowed to register in the summer in a number of hours not exceeding 6 credit hours. The hours of thesis registration are not counted within these hours

Study Dates:

- 1- The fall semester starts on the third Saturday of September for a period of 15 academic weeks.
- 2- Spring semester starts on the second Saturday of February for 15 academic weeks.
- 3- Summer semester starts on the first Saturday of July for 8 academic weeks.

Regulations

- General conditions for admission and registration:
 1. A student with a bachelor's degree in Pharmacy from one of the universities recognized by the Supreme Council of Universities will be accepted to study for graduate studies programs if he meets the requirements for admission to each program.
 2. The student must meet the selection conditions set by each scientific department separately, and obtain approval from the relevant department council and faculty council.
 3. The student must fulfill the required documents and forms from the Department of Graduate Studies in the faculty.
 4. The date of student registration starts from the date of registration of the first course of study. If the student does not register courses in the first semester after his registration, the registration for him will be canceled.
