Admission Requirements and Language of Instruction

Program Facilities



Program Structure

The Bachelor of Pharmacy "Clinical Pharmacy" program (credit hour system) divided on ten semesters (five academic years) of full-time study each of 15 weeks. An optional 6-8 week summer semester is also provided. The program is designed to offer courses in a three stage building-up strategy starting with the basic sciences including biological, chemical and physical sciences in the first four semesters followed by the second stage of applied sciences such as medical and pharmaceutical sciences, drug information and therapeutics. Finally, the program provides the third and most important stage of a well-supervised real practice training in the form of: "At least" 200 hours of training in pharmacy setting along with "a minimum of" 100 hours of clinical training in hospitals.
